DCDC presented their first quarterly newsletter with new branding.



## MAY 2022




DCDC helped to start the Dunlap Flower Club - a group of community members who are focused on enhancing Dunlap's main street and public areas with greenery.

DCDC organized a group of volunteers to paint and repair Dunlap's historic carnival games.






DCDC and the City of Dunlap teamed up to support Boyer Valley Schools, pulling a float through the Homecoming Parade.

## JANUARY 2023




DCDC recruited pharmacy services to return to Dunlap, finalizing a lease agreement with OneroRX.

the National Railroad Historical Society.






DCDC produced marketing materials that draw attention to the variety of activities that can be enjoyed seasonally in and around town.

# FEBRUARY 2023






DCDC recruited Horizon Physical Therapy to offer services in town. A lease agreement was finalized for Horizon PT to utilize space in the DCDC building.

As I round the corner on my first year in the position of DCDC Executive Director, I am pleased to share with you some of the things I experienced and learned, as well as the objectives that DCDC has for the year to come.

First, I would like to express my deep gratitude for DCDC. I will admit, that I knew minimal about DCDC's portfolio when I started this job, but I quickly learned how DCDC has been a pivotal contributor to the growth and sustainability of our community for over twenty years.



The most recent and relevant example of DCDC's sucesses is the purchase of the building former owned by Burgess Health and Pharmacy. Without DCDC, I speculate what the long term use of the building would be. With a lot of square footage, a unique layout, and pressure from the community to return pharmacy services to town, DCDC had an uphill challenge in their efforts to occupy the space. However, I can share with great enthusiasm - in the words of one of our City Council members, "DCDC continues to make lemonade from lemons," with the recruitment of three new wellness related entities to town and more space yet available to lease.

As important as DCDC is, the Board and its focus is nothing without a supportive community. This support is amplified by a thriving relationship with the City of Dunlap and Boyer Valley Schools. I have had the exciting opportunity of witnessing firsthand the strengthening of these important relationships in the last year. DCDC relies heavily on assistance from both of these entities in our efforts to move the community forward and greatly appreciates these entities and their shared intentions.

DCDC stands for Dunlap Community Development Corporation.
