








Dorothy's Diner In Legion Building






The building at 111 lowa Ave. has had a long list of owners.

The previous owner for many years was the American Legion Post 224. One afternoon a few years ago part of the backside fell down.


Dunlap Community Development Corp. stepped in took over the ownership and repaired the back side. They then put it up for sale and Nathan bought the property.


It is now a beautiful building in downtown Dunlap once again.
