

2026 Dunlap Putt the Putt

Goal of event – To host a fundraising event for DCDC in partnership with the Dunlap Golf Course that is fun for participants, promotes community spirit, and gets people in the doors of local businesses.

Rain or shine.

Requirement of Site Host

- Must be a DCDC member in the current membership year to host a green. Not a member? Become one today! Email DunlapDCDC@gmail.com to learn how.
- Must construct or purchase (at business' expense) a putting green.
- Must provide a person on-site to score keep for the location / act as location captain.
- Any snacks/beverages offered are at the discretion and expense of the host.
- All putting greens will be along main street. If a business' location is off main street, they will be asked to bring their putting green to the main street sidewalk. If it rains, we will find an indoor space on main street for their putting green.
- The Dunlap Golf Course is the only location for a putting green that will not be on main street and it will be the final putt for all teams.

Team Information

- 4 people per team
- Shotgun start along main street
- Order of holes and rules to be provided to teams and hosts in advance (likely clockwise along main street with final hole at golf course).
- \$200 / team
- Best score of 4 people at each hole counts for teams score at that hole.
- Max score of 6 at each hole to keep teams moving.
- Teams are required to provide/transport their own putter(s).

Location Captain

- Order of holes and rules to be provided to teams and hosts/captains in advance.
- Scorecards to be managed by location captains with final scores to be texted/delivered to DCDC at the Golf Course.

Winners

- In the event of a tie-breaker, the Golf Course will dictate how to handle it.
- Winner to be announced after final putt is made at the golf course/all scores are tallied.

Rules

Each hole will have a location captain. The assigned location captain will call for each team when it is that team's turn. The location captain will also answer any questions and will be the final decision maker for the hole if a conflict arises. The location captain will mark scores for each team and then send a photo of the scorecard to DCDC representative for final score tallying.

Teams will consist of up to 4 individual team members. In appropriate circumstances, a player may be substituted in for one of the original four team members after the beginning of the tournament only at the discretion of the location captain. If a team has less than four players at any station when it is that team's turn to participate, the team members that are present must complete the station without the missing team member. A team member that misses his or her opportunity to participate at the hole will NOT be able to go back to the hole to finish. At the location captain's discretion, a bartender or other person not already in the tournament may be allowed to hit for a team member that is not present.

One team member will complete the hole at a time. Since each team's score for that hole will be the single team player with the lowest score, team members can elect not to finish or to skip participation of the hole if satisfied with the team score.

At any given hole, the team's score from that hole will be the lowest score from one team member. For instance, if the Team's shots are as follows: Team Member 1 [5 shots]; Team Member 2 [5 shots]; Team Member 3 [6 shots]; Team Member 4 [3 shots], that team's score for the hole played would be a "3" as it is the lowest score that any team member received on that hole.

On some holes there may be a long approach or a water/sand obstacle. If a player shoots and his or her ball falls off the long narrow approach (or off the hole in any other way) or comes to a stop in the water/sand obstacle, the player will then take a penalty shot and will drop the ball at the designated drop spot. For e.g., if a player's first shot at the hole with the long approach falls off the turf and lands on the floor prior to reaching the 8-foot platform, that player will place their ball at the drop spot and will be shooting 3 (third shot) for purposes of scoring.
